Opening Thoughts

- Rationale for this topic

- As international tutors, we have had a few sessions where students came with perceptions that we were not as qualified as tutors whose native language is English to help them with their writing.
- Since scholarship on international Writing Center tutors is limited, we would like to learn about other tutors' experiences.
- We hope to co-create possible strategies that can help international tutors recognize their assets and tools to deal with possible challenges they may encounter.

Definition of "affordance"

- 1. The "possibilities, or opportunities, for action that an agent perceives in a behavioral setting what Heidegger (1962) calls a 'work-world'- in light of their aims and intentions and their capabilities" (Aspbury-Miyanishi, 2022, p. 3).
- 2. "the perceived and actual properties of the thing, primarily those fundamental properties that determine just how the thing could possibly be used" (Norma, 1988, p.9).

- Overview of the results

- We received four responses to our survey, and the perspectives were varied.
- Some tutors felt that their consciousness that they were not native speakers of English affected their confidence.

"Being a 'non-native speaker of English' makes me feel like I have to constantly prove in some way that I'm qualified to be a writing instructor."

Some international tutors referred to the time constraints of the session

"Sometimes it is difficult to foster a collaborative session, because our cultural codes might be different. It is difficult to build common collaborative conditions in 40 minutes or 1 hour."

"On the other hand, domestic tutors are usually experts in their language, so the challenges I've encountered have been more related to understanding texts with complex grammar and vocabulary in a short period and finding ways to help them elevate them."

Some tutors felt that they needed more support with grammar instruction.

"The grammatical support they [WC clients] sometimes expect (which I resonate with) is sometimes challenging for me to provide."
